THANKSGIVING

Laughter will fill the halls as students enjoy this bulletin board of turkeys in disguise.



Materials

- ◆ Turkey template (page 22)
- ◆ glue
- ◆ scissors
- ◆ colored pencils and markers
- ◆ construction paper
- ◆ craft materials (buttons, lace, yarn, aluminum foil, ribbon, sequins, pom-poms, etc.)

Creating the Bulletin Board

- Give each student a copy of the Turkey template.
- Have students cut out the turkey and use craft materials to disguise it so it won't get eaten on Thanksgiving Day. You'll soon have turkeys disguised as clowns, hippies, zebras, superheroes, cows, and cowboys.

Students should allow some features—like the beak and feet—to poke out of the disguises.

- Hang the turkeys on a bulletin board under a banner that reads Who? Me?
- Students can add a “dialogue balloon” next to their turkey if they wish. (The hippie turkey could say, “Cool, man,” and the cow turkey could say, “Moo.”)
- You might consider asking the art teacher to conduct this activity.
